ABOUT THE PROGRAM

St Petersburg College's Emergency Medical Services Associate in Science Degree gives you a liberal arts education to enrich your medical background. If you have completed EMT and Paramedic certification, this degree provides the perfect way to advance in your career field.

Florida Licensed Paramedics who have completed EMT, Paramedic, or both programs at St Petersburg College may be eligible for our Emergency Medical Services A.S. degree.

Students pursuing the Emergency Medical Services A.S. Degree must complete at least one of the EMT or Paramedic programs at SPC and satisfactorily complete 25 percent of the semester hours *(minimum of 19 credits)* required for graduation at St. Petersburg College.

Students with an active EMT license **or** who completed their EMT or Paramedic program(s) at a qualifying institution in the <u>Florida College System</u> or one of <u>Florida's District Postsecondary Institutions</u> may be eligible to receive free articulated credit towards the Emergency Medical Services A.S. degree program at SPC. Admission to the Emergency Medical Services A.S. degree program must be completed before articulated credit can be awarded.

The program will accept and review applications throughout the year for the next available term.

	To be admitted, students must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.00 on a 4.00 scale in all postsecondary coursework. 	Applicants must have completed EMT and Paramedic certification from a CoAEMSP-accredited program.
	To be admitted, students must have completed a minimum of 12 credit hours of EMS coursework through the completion of the EMT-ATD, Firefighter/EMT combined (PSAV), Paramedic ATD or Paramedic Certificate program at St Petersburg College to meet the college's residency graduation requirement. Articulated credit awarded for the above-mentioned programs completed at SPC will be considered toward satisfying residency graduation requirements.
	Applicants who are seeking articulation credit for EMS courses must adhere to articulation standards and timelines to be awarded articultion credit. See Articulation Agreements on page 3 of this Admission Guide.

- Transcripts for course credit earned by exam(s) (e.g., AP, CLEP) must be provided from the originating testing agency.
- Transfer courses for which there is no direct SPC equivalent will be posted as **elective credit** and designated with a '999' course number; additionally, **upper division** transfer credits are not posted automatically for lower division programs.

Articulating Credits

Individuals who completed their EMT or Paramedic program(s) at a qualifying institution in the <u>Florida College System</u> or one of <u>Florida's District Postsecondary Institutions</u> may be eligible to receive free articulated credit towards the Emergency Medical Services A.S. program at SPC.

Official transcripts will need to be provided to St Petersburg College to complete the appliation evaluation.

Once admitted, the student will be required to submit a request to have articulated credits posted to their SPC record. Instructions will be provided in the admission notification email.

Articulation Agreements

EMT Emergency Medical Technician Industry certification

- 1. Students must hold a valid, active certification, earned or renewed within the past five (5) years.
- 2. Students must provide a copy of their certification transcripts. If the certifying body does not offer transcripts, the student must provide a copy of their certificate.

Emergency Medical Technician Applied Technology Diploma (ATD) – Statewide Articulation

- 1. Students must have successfully completed the full ATD program required for the articulation.
- 2. Students must provide official transcripts from the institution where they completed the ATD program to SPC. Students who completed the program at SPC do NOT need to provide transcripts; their program completion will be verified via their SPC student records.
- 3. Students must enroll in the A.S. degree program and request articulation credit within five (5) years of completing the ATD program.

Firefighter/EMT Combined Career Certificate Program Articulation

- 1. Students must have successfully completed the full Career Certificate program required for the articulation.
- 2. Students must provide official transcripts from the institution where they completed the ATD program to SPC. Students who completed the program at SPC do NOT need to provide transcripts; their program completion will be verified via their SPC student records.
- 3. Students must enroll in the A.S. degree program and request articulation credit within five (5) years of completing the ATD program.

Paramedic Paramedic Applied Technology Diploma - Statewide Articulation

- 1. Students must have successfully completed the full ATD program required for the articulation.
- 2. Students must provide official transcripts from the institution where they completed the ATD program to SPC. Students who completed the program at SPC do not need to provide transcripts; their program completion will be verified via their SPC student records.
- 3. Students must enroll in the A.S. degree program within five (5) years of completing the ATD program.
